Six times per year this report will be filled out by the teacher and sent to you for inspection. If this report is not presented at the proper time, kindly notify the teacher or principal.

If a pupil receives a failing mark in any subject, it should be made a matter of immediate inquiry. Possibly it is to be attributed to a lack of study, to too many outside engagements, to irregular attendance, or to some cause which can be removed.

Special attention is called to the serious consequences of irregular attendance. It is important to remember that the loss of even a portion of a school lesson often proves to be a serious interruption of progress; and tends to produce a lack of interest in the school work. Excuses showing good cause for the absence or tardiness should always be sent promptly on the return of a child to school. Neglect of this may cause the child to be sent home for the excuse.

We suggest that you talk over this report with your child each time it is received, and if it has any particular needs which are indicated to you by the marks on this card, that you confer with the teacher, principal or superintendent regarding it.

If parents show their interest in the child and the school by occasional visits to the school, it will prove a great source of inspiration and help to both pupil and teacher.
