My dear Mr. Krieg:

Receipt is acknowledged of your letter of December 29, 1942 with reference to the transmission with the official mail of a pair of glasses for your son, Mr. William L. Krieg, American Vice Consul at Lagos, Nigeria.

Our Mail Division advises me that there is a record of the receipt of one insured parcel, contents unknown, from Crane-Krieg-Flory Co., Newark, Ohio, (insured no. 2328) for William L. Krieg at Lagos, which parcel was received here on August 24, 1942 for onward transmission to Lagos. It is believed your son should contact the American Legation at Monrovia for the particulars of further delivery to Lagos.

If other parcels for Mr. Krieg were sent by insured mail in care of the Department since your letter of December 29, last, it is suggested that you advise the Department of the insured number of the parcel, since to date our Mail Division advises me they have no record of the receipt in that office of such a package. A package by ordinary mail would not necessarily be made a matter of record in the Department.

There are enclosed for your information two information sheets setting forth the manner in which it is suggested mail matter should be submitted to insure inclusion with the official mail abroad.
