We have no idea how many thousands of people have called at the Consulate. If their papers are in order, we type their names on a form statement, L'Heureux signs it, and we shoot them out. We worked all day Saturday, all day Sunday, and Monday, Wednesday and Friday nights. I had a nice Thanksgiving – after work. I went to Hugh Teller's for dinner. After a couple of cocktails, we had an excellent meal. Besides Hugh & his wife, who is extraordinarily attractive, there was Dr. Fishburn & his wife, one of our medical advisors, and Cliff Treble. After dinner we started to drink Scotch & soda, and the six of us drank a bottle and a half. About 2 o'clock we went to a night
