




1. Stuttgart seen from the tower of the railway station



Stuttgart viewed from the tower of the railroad station. This is the main business street.






2. Central Railway Station

The railroad station. The natives think it's a fine building, but most foreigners think it look more like a prison than anything else.




3. City Hall




4. New Palace

The Old Castle burned out a few years ago and is now in the course of reconstruction.




a museum enumentating the achievements of germans who lived in steign experies.

The State theater




Formely a frunt extel and one official receptions.

This castle is a few miles from town, and was built by one of the kings for his mistress.






13. Wilhelma Palace (Württemberg in the background)

A publilc indoor swimming pool.






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15. Lake Max-Eyth, Stuttgart-Hofen on the Neckar
