the Foreign Service he suggested that it might be a good idea for me to take Russian while I was here, as he thought that would soon be a large field of opportunity. He said he thought that history was even more important than political science, and he was very pleased to hear that I was already taking a course in history. He recommended further Latin courses, and informed me that next year I would have Prof. Burton first semester and Prof. Stearns. Prof. Stearns is very nice; I have already met him several times.

Friday I went over to see the "Big Dean". He was not very cordial: I have heard that if he is in a good humor, he will invite you in to sit down (inside the railing). Although I looked longingly at the big leather chair, he made no movement to let me in. He read Prof. Messer's note and asked me what I wanted. I told him I was interested in Latin and that if I had to take two natural sciences next year I would have to stop Latin. He said that there was a committee that took care of relieving people of their requirements, and that they didn't like to do it. He suggested that he would let me take one science next year and one the next after that (Junior year). Messer had already warned me that the Dean might do that, and if he did to accept, as the Dean might change his mind by next year. 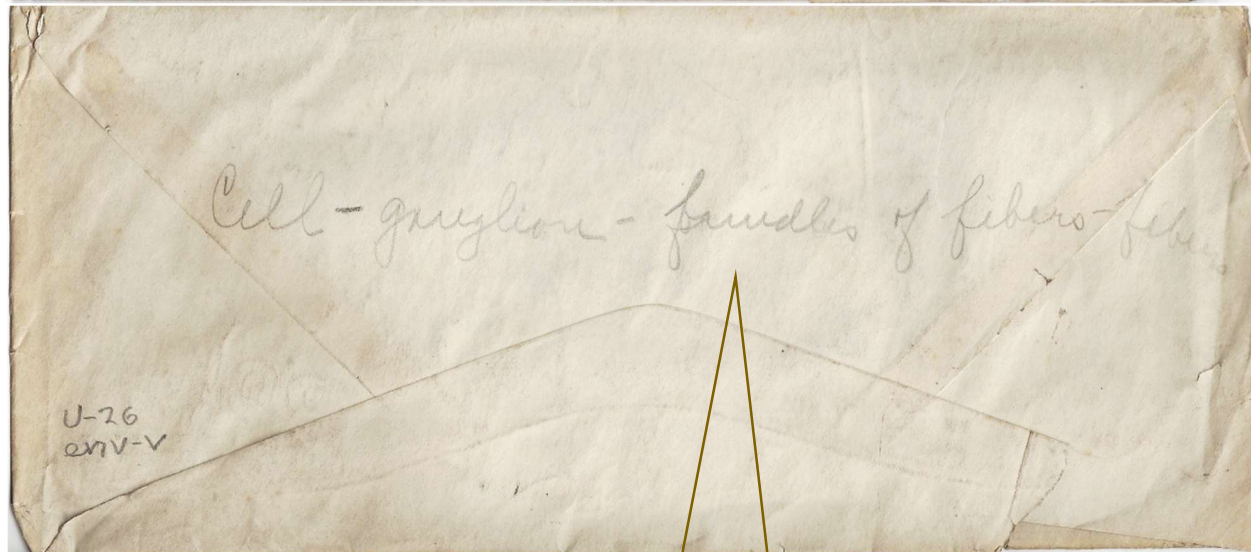
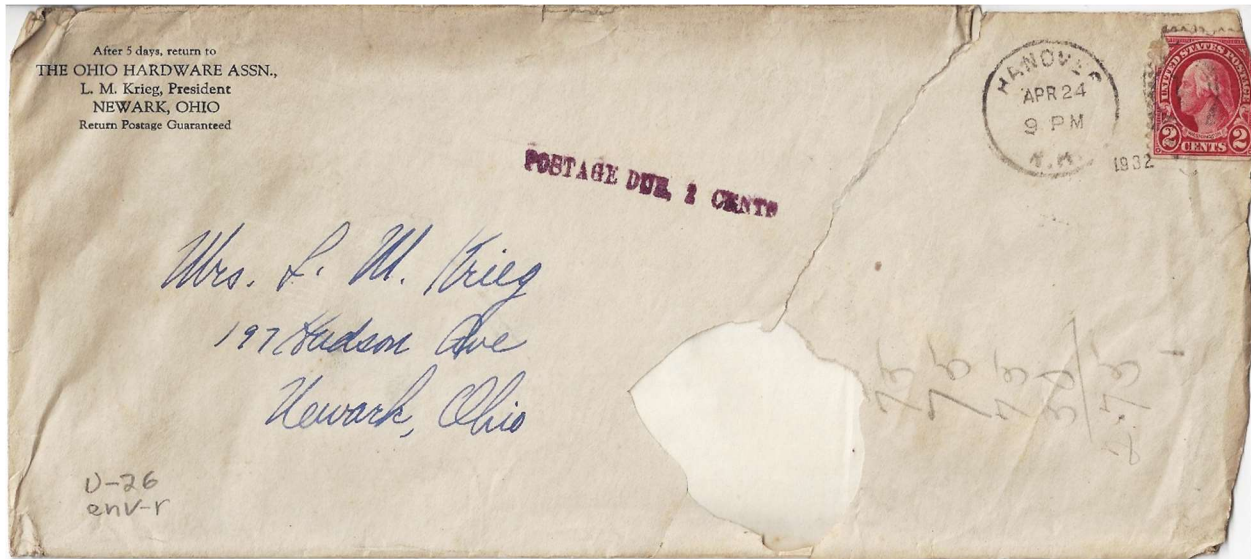
