I bought a tan sleeveless sweater at Campion's which ought to do well for the coming warm season. At any rate, I will not be worried about the sleeves wearing out.

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in Middle Mass. His room here is on the north side where he never gets any sunlight, so he is going to move. The deposit fee of \$10.00 is required when you sign up for your room.
