We have just returned from Cambridge, and we have had a wonderful week end. Of course you know how the game came out. It was very exciting all the way through. I stayed with Jake Kuhn. These are luxuriously furnished. The dining rooms serve meals for \$8.50 per week, which is the cheapest thing I found down there. I certainly wish we had in Hanover eating facilities as good as that.

Kate Montgomery is looking well, and I think I gave her a wonderful time. We went after the game to eat with Dick and his sister, Chuck Richards and Bob Prentice at the Parker House. We got in the main dining room by mistake and had a fine meal at a high price. After that Dick and Caroline went home to Andover, and the boys and Kate and I went to a movie. It was the 'Gay Divorcee' and certainly was excellent. After that I took
