Since you are one of the fellowship applicants, I simply wish you to know, before the public announcement is made, that the fact that you are not among the recipients of fellowship awards indicates only that the Committee had an extremely difficult task deciding upon the candidates to whom fellowship awards would be recommended, and that the failure of the Committee to recommend you does not indicate any lack of confidence in your potentialities for scholarship or in your ability to use a fellowship effectively.

Professor Sikes told me as he brought the recommendations to the President that the selections had been quite difficult among the large number of well-accredited applicants, and I imagine that in a number of cases a very slight factor was sufficient to throw the balance in favor of a successful candidate as against a number of other exceedingly well-qualified applicants.
